Dear Acting Secretary Pinkham and Lieutenant General Graham:

On November 18, 2024, we wrote to express our deep concern regarding the inability of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) and America's dredging and maritime construction industry to perform maintenance dredging for the Brunswick Harbor during the available window before environmental restrictions on dredging take effect.

We continue to be alarmed by the failure to award this project and perform operation and maintenance dredging for the Brunswick Harbor and the costly project delays that will result from this collective failure.

The Port of Brunswick is vital to Georgia's economic growth and is poised to become the Nation's busiest automotive port in the near future. The sustained success and future expansion of port operations relies on timely and effective dredging of the harbor. For this reason, we secured funding so the Corps had the resources necessary to dredge the Brunswick Harbor to its fully authorized depth and width for the first time in many years.

After multiple failed attempts to award an acceptable dredging contract, the Corps also appears unable to efficiently deploy reserve dredges to perform this critical mission.

This collective failure to execute a basic mission with ample funding provided by Congress raises serious concerns about the Corps' ability to effectively and collaboratively execute such projects in future years.
