Dear Administrator Zeldin:

As members of the Georgia, Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee Congressional delegations, we write to express our profound concern about the termination of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) employees in Atlanta, Georgia, Region 4 office, including the Laboratory Services and Applied Science Division in Athens, Georgia, and the Gulf of America Division in Gulfport, Mississippi, as well as the impact these terminations could have on public health and our environment.

Reports indicate that EPA staff members have received emails indicating immediate dismissal due to their probationary status. We are deeply concerned about the negative impacts such terminations—done across the board without consideration for positional need or programmatic impact—would have on the agency's ability to protect public health and the environment in Georgia, Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee and across the nation.

Though they are probationary, many of these employees are long-standing federal workers and subject matter experts with experience vital to running the EPA effectively and efficiently. They perform critical research on air, climate, and energy, including chemical use, wastewater generation, water use, fuel use and vehicle emissions, solid waste disposal, paper use, and electronics equipment.

The dismissal of employees at the EPA Region 4 offices threatens the health and safety of all states in Region 4 and will undermine ongoing efforts to monitor and improve air and water quality, manage hazardous waste, and restore the ecosystem of the largest freshwater system in the world.

We urge you to consider the critical importance of these workers to the EPA's mission and the potential adverse effects these terminations have on public health and the environment in our Nation.
